

Make Your Own Pollution Catcher

Supplies:

- Paper plate
- Hole punch or pencil for making holes
- Petroleum jelly
- 4 wire paper clips (or string) to hang your pollution catcher



Instructions:

- 1) Turn your paper plate upside down on your workspace and make four holes in your plate – two on the top and two on the bottom – using a pencil or hole punch.
- 2) Take the four paper clips (string will also work), fold them out and guide them through each of the holes in your paper plate.
- 3) Now turn your paper plate back face up, take a big scoop of petroleum jelly and generously spread on the surface of the plate. The petroleum jelly is sticky and will catch the particulate matter in the air.
- 4) Finally, find a good place outside to hang your plate to catch pollution.
