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Louisiana Sea Grant Putting Science to Work for Coastal Communities

Feb. 1, 2020 to Jan. 31, 2021 highlights

With the help of Louisiana Sea Grant, Louisiana seafood companies were able to participate and successfully bid in the USDA Shrimp Purchase Program – selling 174,000 cases of shrimp valued at \$19.6 million to the USDA. By selling their shrimp inventories, more than 30 jobs were retained at seafood processing facilities.





Due to COVID-19, Louisiana Sea Grant could not hold an in-person Ocean Commotion for K-8 students. Consequently, LSG shifted to a virtual event with 27 exhibitors creating Louisiana-centric science and environmental content. Twenty-four classrooms and their teachers attended, and nearly 3,800 virtual visitors have explored the exhibits.

Working with partners in the southwest part of the state, Louisiana Sea Grant helped steer \$712,000 in grant funds and donations to 40 eligible commercial fisheries businesses – which included fishing vessels, docks and processors – impacted by 2020's Hurricane Laura.

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
