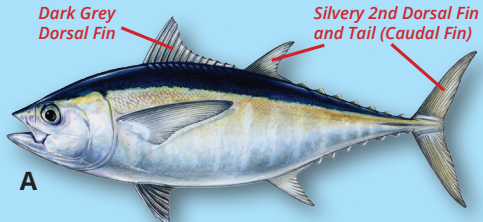


# HOW TO IDENTIFY TUNA

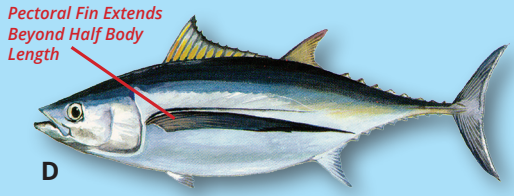
1. Has dark grey dorsal fin; silvery second dorsal fin and tail (See fish A) ..... **Blackfin tuna**  
Dorsal fin is not dark grey; second dorsal fin and tail is not silvery (Go to 2).
2. Has dark horizontal stripes on belly; no markings on back (Fish B) ..... **Skipjack tuna**  
2. Does not have stripes on belly; has markings on back (Go to 3).
3. Has vertical bars on back (Fish C) ..... **Yellowfin tuna**  
3. Does not have vertical bars on back (Go to 4).
4. Pectoral fin extends beyond half of the body length (Fish D) ..... **Albacore tuna**  
4. Pectoral fin does not extend beyond half of the body length (Go to 5).
5. Has a reddish-brown second dorsal fin (Fish E) ..... **Bluefin tuna**  
5. Second dorsal fin is not reddish-brown (Go to 6).
6. Pectoral fin does not extend beyond half the body length;  
yellow finlets; no striping on belly or sides (Fish F) ..... **Bigeye Tuna**



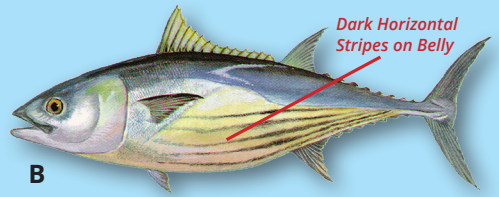

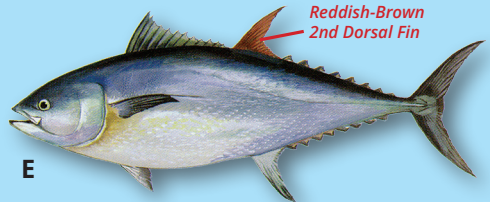

**Blackfin Tuna**



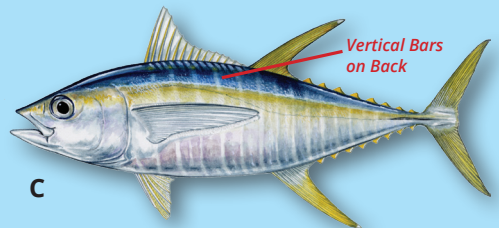

**Albacore Tuna**



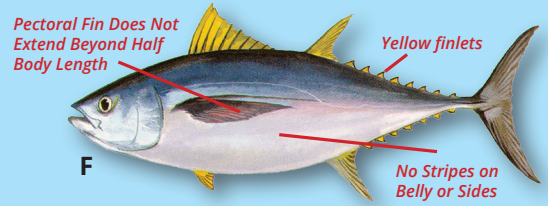
